- Five day supply of food for each pet
- Five day supply water
- Water-tight containers for supplies
- Collar and ID tag for each pet
- Leash, harness, carrier or cage for each pet
- Medications and medical records
- Pet first aid kit & first aid booklet
- Food & water bowls
- Litter & litter box
- Litter scoop
- Bedding for small mammals & reptiles
- Current photos and description (in case of separation)

Other Useful items

- Blankets or pet beds
- Pet "comfort toy"
- Paper towels or newspapers (for use as cage liners or for clean up)
- Manual can opener (if you are bringing canned food)
- Plastic garbage bags
- Liquid soap
- Bleach
- Flashlight & batteries
- Radio
- Duct tape
- Rope
- Tarp
- Whistle
- Permanent marker
- Baby wipes
- Cash
- Cell phone and charger

Be sure to update your emergency plan occasionally, and replenish any perishable items. With this plan, you'll be prepared to take care of your pets in case of an emergency.

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
